Birds of Hopetown

The bird of the week is one which we sometimes steer clear of. It is the Plover, also known as Masked Lapwings, which are fairly large birds. They have long reddish legs and large yellow facial wattles. They inhabit virtually the whole of Australia and are commonly found on the shores of swamps and lakes. They also inhabit large grassy areas, particularly those areas such as parks.

Plovers usually lay their eggs after local rains and will hatch in about 28 days They lay up to four eggs on the ground in a small depression in open areas so they can see their predators.

Plovers have spurs on their wings however despite common belief, these are not poisonous.

Plover aggression - swooping and screeching

Plovers are very protective of their nests and chicks. This is particularly the case after the chicks have hatched. Adults will dive on intruders, use loud noises and swooping or act as though they have a broken wing in an attempt to lure the intruder away from the nest.

This behaviour is mostly bluff and actual contact attacks are rare. Regardless, it is this fearlessly protective nature that brings them into conflict with people.

A Central Coast high jumper wins SILVER in the Olympics!

Nicola McDermott, from North Gosford added achieved a record-setting win with a silver medal on Saturday night.



She established herself as a new national hero by winning Australia's fifth ever high jump medal at an Olympics.

McDermott was also observed writing in her journal and on her t-shirt between attempts, and when asked she replied: "Writing on a T-shirt is another process of my athletics processing. I was writing each time I jumped a bar, it allowed me to zone off "

Skateboarder Keegan Palmer has won Australia's first Olympic skateboarding medal – and it was GOLD! 18 year old Palmer came into the event final ranked fifth, but shot to the front when he delivered an amazing first run score of 94.04. He backed that up with a 95.83 on his final run.

The rest of the field was not even close, with



Brazil's Pedro Barros claiming silver with a score of 86.14. Palmer was destined for skating success from a young age, first stepping on a skateboard at the age of two.
